The Ohio Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force is a collaboration of city, county, state and federal law enforcement agencies under the direction of the Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office. Our mission is to identify, arrest and prosecute individuals who use the Internet to exploit children.

The **Ohio ICAC Task Force** conducts outreach presentations to local schools and community organizations at **NO COST**. These presentations offer important information on how children can stay safe while they use the Internet. Community presentations are geared toward two main audiences: **children and teens** who use the Internet, and **parents, educators and community members** who are dedicated to keeping them safe.



Computer Cop is a free monitoring software program. It can scan your computer for unwanted files and text, and record online instant messaging conversations. "The Dark Side of the Internet That May Be Affecting You and Your Children" is a presentation by the Ohio Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force that will provide parents with a better understanding of the dangers on the Internet and also provide tips to keep children and families safe. The presentation will provide an overview of the problem areas, warning signs to look for and how to react if you find your child has been victimized on the Internet.

PLAYING IT SAFE IN YOUR CYBERHOOD

"What You Don't Know About the Internet Can Hurt You," is geared toward middle and high school students that teaches them about the dangers of instant messaging, mobile apps, cyberbullying and more. Paired with real life tales of ICAC cases, this presentation is great for children and teens.



Established in 1984, the **National Center for Missing & Exploited Children**® is the leading nonprofit organization in the U.S. working with law enforcement, families and the professionals who serve them on issues related to missing and sexually exploited children. The Internet has become a primary tool for sexually exploiting children, NCMEC established the **CyberTipline**, which provides a centralized mechanism for the public and electronic service providers to report suspected child sexual exploitation.
